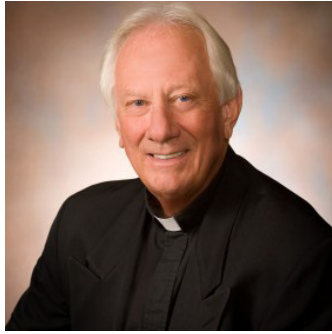

ABOUT THE PRESENTERS



Father Richard Gielow, Congregation of the Mission (C.M.) was born in LaSalle, Illinois in 1943 to Virginia and Robert Gielow. He was ordained a priest of the Congregation of the Mission of Saint Vincent DePaul in 1970. From 1971 to 1976 Fr. Gielow served as Director of Vocations for the Vincentian Fathers and Brothers. In 1976, he was appointed Rector and Principal of St. John's High School Seminary in Kansas City, Missouri and held that position for six years. In 1982 Fr. Dick was then asked to join the Vincentian Parish Mission Team and has been a member of that team until the present time.

Father Gielow holds a B.A. in Philosophy, a Masters of Divinity (M.Div.) in Theology from DeAn-dreis Institute of Theology and a Masters of Arts in Religious Education from the Catholic Uni-versity in Washington, D.C. He is listed in the Midwest and Religious sections of Who's Who in America as a "well known preacher and retreat director".

Currently, Father Gielow is the Director of the Vincentian Parish Mission Center in Kansas City, Missouri. He is also the National Spiritual advisor to the Ladies of Charity of United States of America.

Fr. Robert Gielow, C.M., his twin brother, is also a Vincentian and a member of the Mission Team. Sometimes, they conduct missions together, which will be the case with our parish. Fr. Gielow's sister, Mary Ann Gielow, is the Director of Development for St. Cyril of Alexandria Parish in Tucson, Arizona.

Fr. Robert Gielow C.M. was born in LaSalle, Illinois in 1943. He attended St. Vincent DePaul High School seminary in Lemont, Illinois and gradu-ated in 1961.

Fr. Bob entered the Vincentian Fathers and Brothers novitiate in 1961. After two years as a novice, he completed his college education at Saint Mary's Seminary in Perryville, Missouri where he was awarded a B.A. de-gree in Philosophy. Father Gielow completed his theology studies at DeAn-dreis seminary in Lemont, Illinois and was ordained in May, 1971.

Upon receiving a Master's degree in Counseling from Southwest Missouri State he joined the fac-ulty of Regina Cleri Seminary in Tucson, Arizona. After four years in Tucson, Father Bob joined the faculty at DePaul University in Chicago, Illinois. During his eight years at the University, he served as Director of Campus Ministry and as Director of Athletics.

After completing his Master's degrees in Divinity and Religious Studies, he became Director of Vo-cations for the Midwest Province of the Vincentians. He served in that capacity for four years and upon completion of a Masters degree in Pastoral Studies at Loyola University in 1987, he joined the Vincentian Parish Mission team.
